## **Grant Development Program**

**2009-2010**

### **Program Description:**

The Center for Justice, Law & Society would like to support the development of grant proposals for graduate students and junior faculty.

In order to facilitate the development of competitive grant applications, the Center will host a facilitated workshop over the academic year. Participants will meet to discuss and develop their proposals, receiving guidance from their fellow participants as well as from senior faculty mentors.

Proposals should further the research agenda of the Center, but topic, funding agency and funding type are open.

The Center will provide a **\$100** stipend for all graduate students and **\$350** stipend for all junior faculty members who successfully complete and file a grant proposal through the Center as part of the program.

### **Eligibility:**

The program is open to all graduate students and junior faculty at George Mason University. In order to receive the grant development stipend, proposals must be submitted by June 15, 2010. Proposals must be submitted through the Center for Justice, Law & Society.

### **Timeline:**

The Center will host a meeting between participants and the Office of Sponsored Programs in the early fall to discuss different funding opportunities. Participants must have a funding opportunity in mind and be willing to submit a brief, draft description of the proposed project to the Center by November 13.

The first workshop will take place in early December, at which time proposals will receive feedback from peers and senior faculty. An additional session will be scheduled in the spring term so that participants may receive feedback on their proposals.
